1 Name

This is the *Radiocommunications (Certificates of Proficiency – Minimum Age) Declaration 2025*.

2 Commencement

This instrument commences at the start of the day after the day it is registered on the Federal Register of Legislation.

3 Authority

This instrument is made under subsection 122(2) of the *Radiocommunications Act 1992*.

4 Repeal

The *Radiocommunications (Minimum Age for Issue of Certificates of Proficiency) Declaration 2015* [F2015L01286] is repealed.

5 Certificates of proficiency – minimum age

For the purposes of subsection 122(2) of the *Radiocommunications Act 1992*, the **minimum age** for a class of certificates of proficiency specified in column 1 of an item of the table is the age declared in column 2 of that item.

Column 1	Column 2
Class of certificate of proficiency	Minimum age
1 Long Range Operator Certificate of Proficiency	16
2 Marine Satellite Communications Endorsement	16
3 Short Range Operator Certificate of Proficiency	16

Note 1: A number of expressions used in this instrument are defined in the Act, including ‘certificate of proficiency’.

Note 2: The names of the classes of certificate of proficiency are based on the names given to certificates by Article 47 of the International Telecommunication Union’s Radio Regulations. The Radio Regulations are available, free of charge, from www.itu.int.
